

What are Oregon personal property taxes and does my small business have to pay this?

If a business is operating in the State of Oregon they must file a personal property tax form each year by March 15th. There are no extensions to the filing date. Forms are available at http://www.oregon.gov/dor/ptd/pages/propform.aspx. Any questions about valuation of business personal property can be addressed by contacting the county assessor in the county the property is located. Failure to complete a personal property tax return may result in penalties being charged.

According to the Oregon Department of Revenue, "Oregon law requires all personal property be valued at 100 percent of its real market value unless exempt by statutes. Personal property is taxable in the county where it is located and has more or less come to rest as of the assessment date, January 1st at 1 a.m. Oregon Revised Statute 307.020 defines both personal and intangible personal property. Intangible personal property is not taxable. Inventories are items of tangible personal property, which are held for sale in the ordinary course of business and are exempt from taxation. Household goods, furniture, clothing, tools, and equipment exclusively for personal use in your home are also exempt from taxation.


Each individual, partnership, firm, or corporation that has taxable personal property must file a return by March 15th. The return filed with the appropriate authority must contain a full listing of all assets, date of acquisition, cost, and a statement of real market value. This listing must include items that have been fully depreciated, are in storage, or have been expensed. It is the responsibility of the taxpayer to obtain a copy of the return and make the filing. If the assessed value of your taxable property is less than \$16,500, the assessor may cancel the tax assessment for that year. You must file a return each year regardless and make your declaration."

What's Happening with the Jordan Cove Energy Project?



Q. Jordan Cove is gathering momentum and soon the Final EIS will be published. What should we expect from now until the end of 2015?

A. The FERC has stated that they fully intend on meeting the September 30 timeline to publish and distribute the Final EIS. The FEIS will contain a lot of information, including impacts, benefits and mitigations, but possibly the most

anticipated section will be the pipeline route and whether or not FERC and BLM decided to choose the Blue Ridge route as the preferred route or if Blue Ridge remains the alternative route. Until the FEIS is published, we have no way of knowing what they chose.

The published FEIS is for public awareness, but is not circulated for comment. This is the final statement that will get filed in Washington, DC and ultimately voted on by the FERC Commissioners. If the FERC staff holds to their timeline then we could see the Commission approving or denying Jordan Cove by the end of 2015. If there is slippage because of the holidays then we may see that vote in January 2016. Between now and then, Jordan Cove may be lined up for a customer announcement and, if all lines up locally, then we may see an announcement on the Community Enhancement Plan.

Additionally, Jordan Cove still has permits filed with various state and local agencies (such as the Conditional Use Permit for our workforce housing site) so there will be movement there as well. We do not know if there will be public hearings in 2015 on those remaining permits, but we COULD see that if an agency feels ready to move forward on a particular application.

Lastly, and as some of you already know, Jordan Cove's team is in a phase of "project optimization" where engineers and contractors re-evaluate the project internally and try to create as many efficiencies as possible. There have been some rumors flying so let us make it clear that any changes to project design can only be done if they are better (cleaner, more efficient, less impactful) than the current design. This means the project is only getting better! The outreach team doesn't have any information on the optimization exercise just yet, but once we do we'll learn all we can and then inform the community.


