March Board minutes were approved.

President Report

Rick reports: March accomplishments, I was invited to attend the 3 A Basketball Tournament opening ceremonies at Marshfield High School. This is a great event for our area. Kudo's to Heidi Proett and her efforts. Tall Ships presentation at the City of Coos Bay Council Chambers. We have the opportunity to host 12 tall ships in 2017. This would be a huge event and is headed by Tom Leahy. Business After Hours was hosted by Northwest Community Credit Union. The event was well attended. The South Coast Community Fund is moving ahead and is working on their Mission statement. Pam Plummer has been meeting with other Coos County Chambers of Commerce. We are working on developing a County business voice. Our Transportation committee supports the Charleston – Bandon Bikeway. The Legislative Action Team continues tracking bills and monitor legislative action. A teleconference is held the first and third Mondays of the month. This is a great opportunity to speak with our representatives in Salem. A team of seven board members attended OSCC Day at the Capital. This was a very productive day. There are many Bills before our legislators. We ask that you write letters to your representatives and let them know where you stand. They do listen and your letters help to reach a decision. The Education Committee will host an Extreme Make Over at North Bend High School on April 11th. Jayson reports that the focus will be the garden area and building planter boxes. Please bring your gardening tools and join us. A BBQ lunch will follow.

The Tourism Committee, chaired by Deborah Rudd, is putting the finishing touches on the Bay Area Brigade on May 2nd. Teams representing the Pirates, Bulldogs and Lakers will compete for the trophy for gathering the most trash. A BBQ lunch will follow at the North Bend Fire Department.

The Membership Committee is promoting a new member challenge. This committee is asking the Board and Chamber members to talk to local businesses and let them know why you belong to the Chamber. Legislative Action Team: Tom asked the Board to encourage businesses to visit the OLIS Oregon website to stay informed on the Bills in Salem that effect small business. Letters of support do make a difference to our Legislators.

Business Development & Support: Pam reports that this committee has reached out to other Chambers in the county. We are looking to impact a number of businesses. The Boom or Bust workshop had 23 attendees. We are working with local businesses to improve customer service. We are working on a program footprint.

We have been attending the Jordan Cove meetings and giving updates to our partners. It is planned to add a segment in the Chamber newsletter.

The Junior Chamber of Commerce is doing great. They will meet with Michael Hinrichs on Thursday at 6 pm at SOCC. This meeting is open to the public.

Transportation: Rick reports this committee meets the 2nd Thursday at the VIC at Noon.

Tourism: Deb reports that this committee meets the 3rd Thursday at the VIC at 8AM. The Bay Area Brigade is scheduled for May 2nd. Teams are coming together for the Pirates, Bulldogs and Lakers. They will be competing for the grand prize of who collected the most trash from their area. Leadership Coos: Pam reports that the topic for Leadership Coos in April is Arts, Entertainment and Recreation. Community Reports

Port of Coos Bay & Charleston: Brooke reports that the annual Oyster Feed will be held on April 25th starting at noon at Oregon Institute of Marine Biology in Charleston.

A Draft of the Strategic plan for the Port is scheduled to come out in May. There will be 3-4 weeks for comments. We are looking for community support.

The Port continues to work on their Budget process using a new financial system.

The Port also is looking to expand staff. Positions to be filled are Director of Marine and Industrial Operations and Director of Business and more to come in the fiscal year.

Peter DeFazio visited our area. Special thanks to the Coos Bay Bar Pilots who took Port staff and the Congressman out on the boat to get a closer look at the North Jetty. We shared the significance of investing in Coos Bay's infrastructure.

Visitor and Convention Bureau:

South Coast Development Council: Connie announced to the board that First Call Resolution (FCR) is scheduled to host a Ribbon Cutting on May 14th. This company is growing and looking to fill positions. Connie leaves on Sunday for a trip to Japan. This visit is to help develop a relationship with Japan to support export, tourism and property development. In speaking with the Japanese representative she learned that the Oregonian is read by the Japanese business people, she reminds the board to include the Oregonian when you are writing letters to the World.

Morgan Veterinary has purchased the building on Hwy 101 which once housed the Kings Table. They are interested in bids to remodel.

May's focus will be Buzz on Buzz and Bandon Customer Service and talking about issues.

June will focus on the Bay Area.

CCD: Theresa reports Regional Business plans coming from SOCC.

She thanks the Chamber for the Spotlight in the Newsletter for CCD.

City of Coos Bay: Timm reports that the council is working on curb appeal projects. The Oregon State University is looking at providing student housing by reinvesting in downtown buildings.

City of North Bend: Timm reports the City continues to work on K2 project. Expecting ships in 10 days. April 6th the Fire Department hosted the 50th annual Pancake Feed. The money made from this event is used to purchase Christmas gifts for children.

There is an Urban Renewal work session planning for the new North Bend Visitor Information Center.
